NEW HANDICAP SYSTEM

What's New?

- **1. You will have a Handicap Index.**
- 2. Handicap categories, Buffer Zones, CSS will no longer exist.

3. Your Handicap Index can then be used to work out your Course Handicap, which means your Handicap will change to reflect the difficulty of the course and the set of tees you elect to play. Every golf club will have a chart available so you can quickly and easily work out your Course Handicap.

- 4. Then just go out and play like you have always done. The WHS doesn't change the way you play the game; it just makes taking your score and measuring your ability fairer and simpler to understand.
- 5. A maximum Handicap Index limit of 54.0, regardless of gender, to encourage more golfers to measure and track their performance to increase their enjoyment of the game

What is a Course Handicap?

For your Handicap Index to be effective and portable across different courses, it must be converted into a Course Handicap to determine the number of strokes you receive for the golf course or tee set that you are playing that day.

You will even be able to convert your Handicap Index to a Course Handicap for the tees you elect to play from when golfing overseas. If pre-registered, these scores can also be returned to your home club for handicap purposes.

Playing Handicap

A Course Handicap in then rounded and converted into a Playing Handicap by applying the appropriate Allowance for the competition format of play.

Submitting scores

Again, nothing will change when playing your game. When you have finished your round, complete your scorecard and this can be entered into the system your club has chosen for the submission of scores. Handicap Indexes are calculated automatically at the end of each day through a cloud based software (Dotgolf).

Casual rounds

From 2nd November 2020, you will now be able to return casual rounds of golf for handicap purposes by pre-registering your round as an acceptable score before you go out and play. If you are playing at a course other than your home club then you can still preregister your score.

You don't have to return a score every time you play golf. Unless you have pre-registered or are playing in a competition, you are not required to return your scorecard. However, the accuracy of your Handicap Index will be improved with every scorecard you submit.

Recap

- General Play will be an authorised format for Handicap Index
 adjustment
- The Handicap Index will be converted to a Course Handicap, which will be converted to the Playing Handicap.
 - The current CSS function will be replaced by the Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC) function
- There will be an ESR function, but calculated differently from
 the current approach.
- The Low Handicap Index function will limit the Handicap Index increase in any 12-month period, replacing the current 1 shot limit.

STEPHENS TIP OF THE WEEK



THE WORST PIECE OF ADVICE IN THE HISTORY OF GOLF!!!

How many times have you been told to "keep your head down"?? How many times have you *told* someone to keep their head down?? How many times have you watched a golfer on television or seen a good golfer in Enniscorthy finish their swing with their head stuck to the ground?? The answer to the third question is never.

Keeping your head down through the swing is counterproductive on 2 fronts. Firstly it prevents you from turning through the shot and transferring your weight correctly with absolutely no body/arm coordination.

Secondly sooner or later you'll pick up a back or a neck injury due to the strain on your body trying to stay still, while your arms swing through with such ferocity.

The correct advice is to try and keep your eye on the ball at the moment of impact and finish with your upper half facing the target.

Beginners and high handicappers should practice brushing the grass and finish facing the target – marry these 2 together and you have a good golf swing. Keep your head down and you will <u>never</u> have a good golf swing.
