RULES OF GOLF

Please go to App store and download R & A Rules of Golf.

This is very useful for up-to-date rules as you can access it on the course if you're in any doubt as to what the rule is about any situation.

HANDICAPS

You can take your first steps towards getting a handicap by playing and recording scores from a total of 54 holes. This can be from any combination of 9 and 18 hole rounds (for example 3x18 holes, 6x9 holes etc.)

Each card must say it is' For Handicap 'and show your name, phone number, date played and the gross score for each hole. You will need to sign the cards and have them verified by a member of the club who has been a member for at least 2 years.

The scorecards must be accompanied by the handicap application form, available at the office or downloaded on EGC website. Your handicap will then be reviewed by the Handicap Committee who will assess the application and furnish you with your new handicap.

Please contact any member of the Committee who will be more than happy to go out and mark your card for you. Our contact numbers will be available in the locker rooms.
